 Murtreesboro, dying March 15, 1863. The company
 was in the Cheat Mountain and Little Sewell Moun-

tain campaigns and at Perryville, Murtreesboro, Chick-
 amauga, Missionary Ridge, Kennesaw, Jonesboro,
 Franklin, and Nashville. It surrendered in North

Carolina.

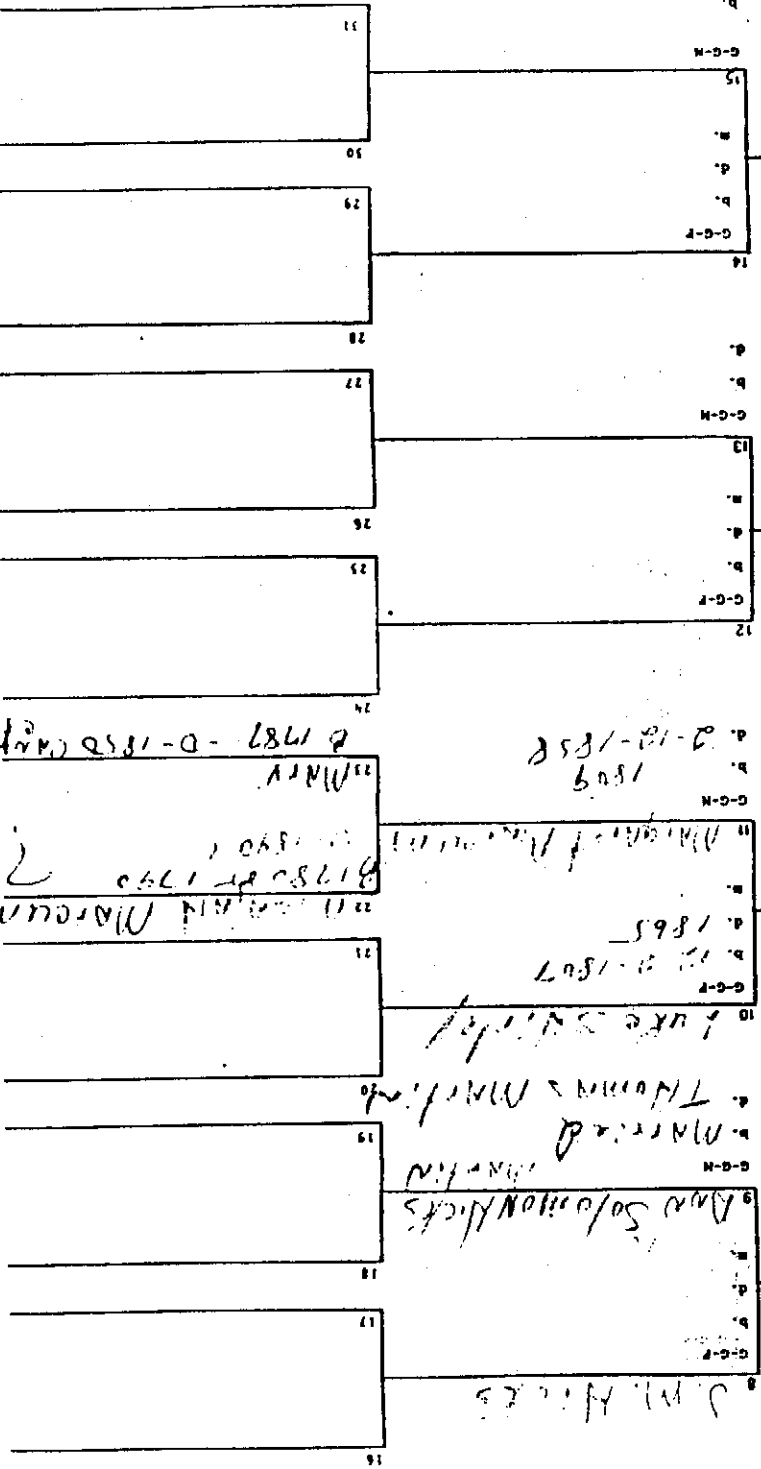

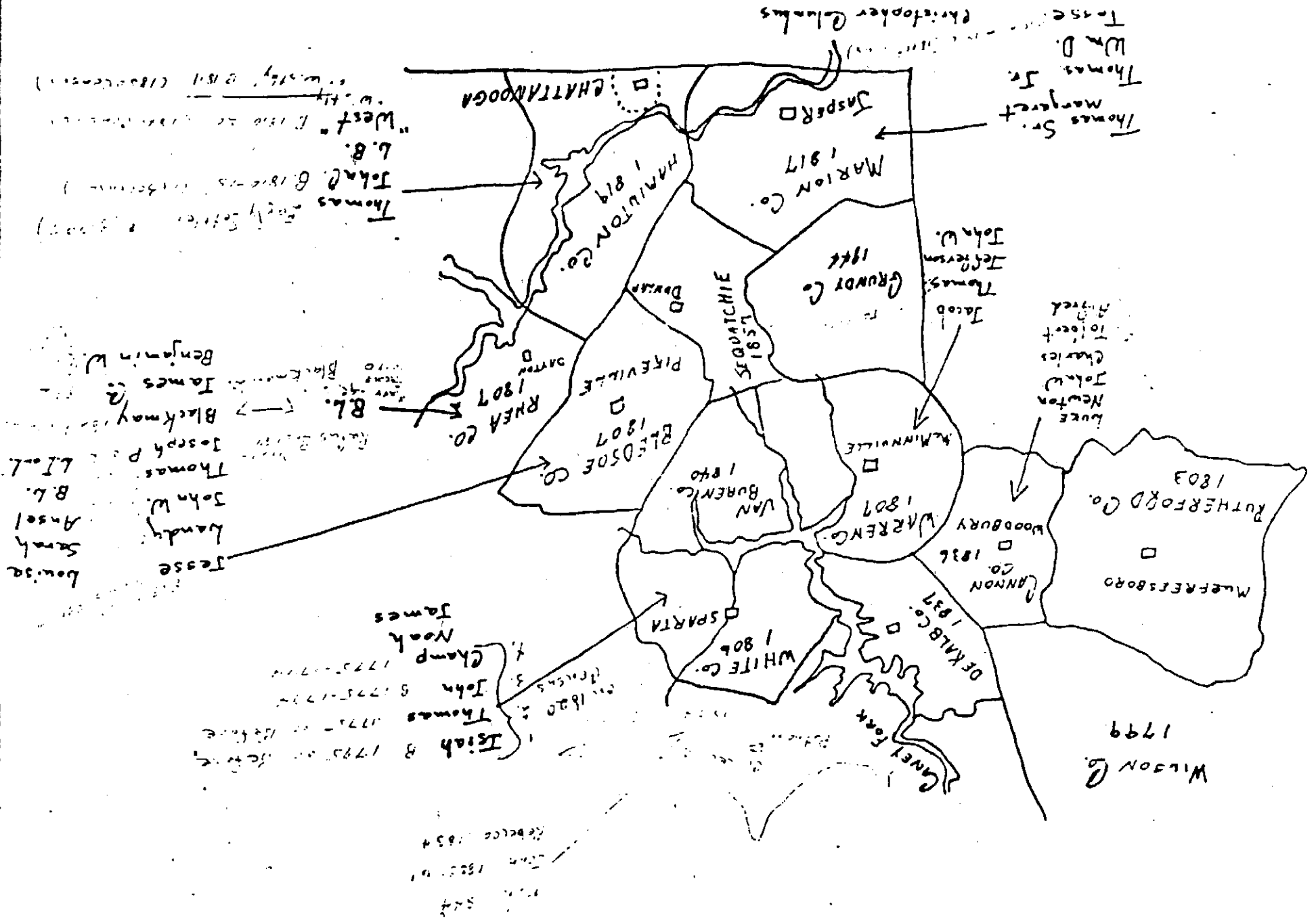

SEVENTH KENTUCKY VOLUNTEER CAVALRY.

The officers of this regiment having failed to furnish a historic record of its early organization, operations, marches, &c., the following statement is taken from the records on file in the Adjutant General's Office:

This regiment was organized at Paris, Kentucky, in August, 1862, under Colonel Leonidas Metcalfe, and was mustered into service by Major L. Sitgraves, United States Mustering Officer. Before the regiment was thoroughly equipped or disciplined, they were ordered into active duty, and engaged in the battle of Big Hill, Kentucky, where they received the charge of the enemy under Kirby Smith, and lost many officers and soldiers in killed, wounded, and prisoners. Owing to the enemy having possession of nearly the entire State, the organization of the regiment was much retarded. In October, 1862, the regiment, under command of Col. Faulkner (Colonel Metcalfe having resigned), was placed upon active duty, and assigned to

the Department of the Cumberland. It was in all the early engagements in Southern Kentucky and Tennessee, and by their gallant bearing and soldierly conduct upon many well-fought fields, won the commendation from the Commanding General.

The regiment has participated in the following named battles in which loss was sustained, in addition to many others not mentioned on the rolls, viz:

Big Hill, Richmond, Cynthiana, and Hopkinsville, Kentucky; Franklin, Triune, Nashville, Tennessee; Lafayette, Besaca, Georgia; Gainesville, King's Hill, Gadsden, Scottsville, Randolph, and near Montgomery, Alabama. The veterans and recruits of this regiment were transferred to the 6th Kentucky Veteran Cavalry.

REMINISCENCES BY IOTA HCKEEVER

"When I was 3 years old my father decided to move to Arkansas to where Papa's Uncle John Seals lived. He petted me and we walked down to a little store and Uncle John sat me up on the counter and bought me a little pair of red slippers. I guess I kept them so long I can remember that so well I was so proud of them.

We only lived there eleven months till we moved back to Hill County near Binum, Texas, then on to Old Brandon, Texas, a little piece from the Semitary where most of our folks are buried now. My Father was restless. In 1897 he and Mr. Lee Lippard planned a trip to move to Trio County in South Texas near Pearsall below San Antonio 53 miles.

When we got to the place they rented the house didn't have a sealing in the kitchen or anywhere and where they set the table the sand and dust just poured down on it. Mama cryed and just begged papa not to unload the wagon but we did.

They had loaded the covered wagon with the things that were necessary - a bed made down on the floor (platform) on springs; a few chairs and our clothes. Had a keg of butter milk tied on the outside of the wagon. It was a covered wagon with 4 big horses. The first day we started one of the wagon wheels caught fire in the hub so they put it out with the buttermilk.

We went on to Waco. The big bridge was froze over and the horses couldn't stand up on the ice to cross as they had shoes on. It was in December. We had to stay there 8 days and nights, during Christmas times, 8 families in this wagon yard.

Mama had made a lot of cookies and cooked up things thinking it would last during the trip but was eat most up there at Waco. Mrs. Lippard had 2 small children and she was well and young. We children and she could get out and walk awhile and take exercise but Mama was sick and couldn't get out and walk. We got started a piece from there and came to a fresh graded road; had to drive down in the ditch and the covered wagon turned over against the fence and bank. If the fence hadn't been so close it would have turned on over. We pulled it up and went on -- just tore the wagon sheet a little. We were a month on the road.

We had never seen prickly pear or cactus and all kinds of thorny bushes even mosquite. Everything had a thorn on it. Prickly pear grew so tall people took pear burners and burnt the thorns off and fixed them for the cows to eat. It was a real dry year. We would cut it up in a trough and put salt over it, had a few corn stalk tops, too. We soon had lots of milk to drink. Penned some of the good Jersey cows and soon were selling butter. Some years we made good crops, other a failure. We got to liking the country and stayed 9 years.

Then my Father wanted to move again. We bought a place near Dawson but only stayed one year then chartered a car and moved back to Jones Co. 7 1/2 miles East of Anson; just stayed 3 1/2 years then moved to Navarron near Silver City.

In 1913 my Husband came after me so we married there at Home. They had built us a nice little house. I didn't have to move much after I married. We lived in one place 32 years and my husband sold that place and bought in a mile of Anson. We lived there 10 years and he passed away. So I moved up here in Anson and live by myself, this will be 11 years first of September. (19/2) I have good neighbors and a daughter next door -- a comfortable place.

...Mine is a true story only didn't get it all in.

Please take note that Geo. O. Hicks says in the 1880 census that he was born in Georgia. And yes, B. N. Hicks nickname was "Son".

Sorry that I don't have the time to pursue the Hicks family, but maybe this will shorten your search.

A couple of suggestions if you want to do a little research on your own: If George Dallas Hicks died between 1900 and 1937, then a record of his death is in the Fern. St. Library and Archives. You will need to know the county he died in and the date he died within a range of three years. His death certificate may provide you with the name of his parents if the informant knew them. (Metropolitan counties began to keep death records earlier.) You might also be interested in obtaining his military records, especially if he drew a pension, or completed a questionnaire. The latter two documents can contain some good info. They also may be found in the Archives.

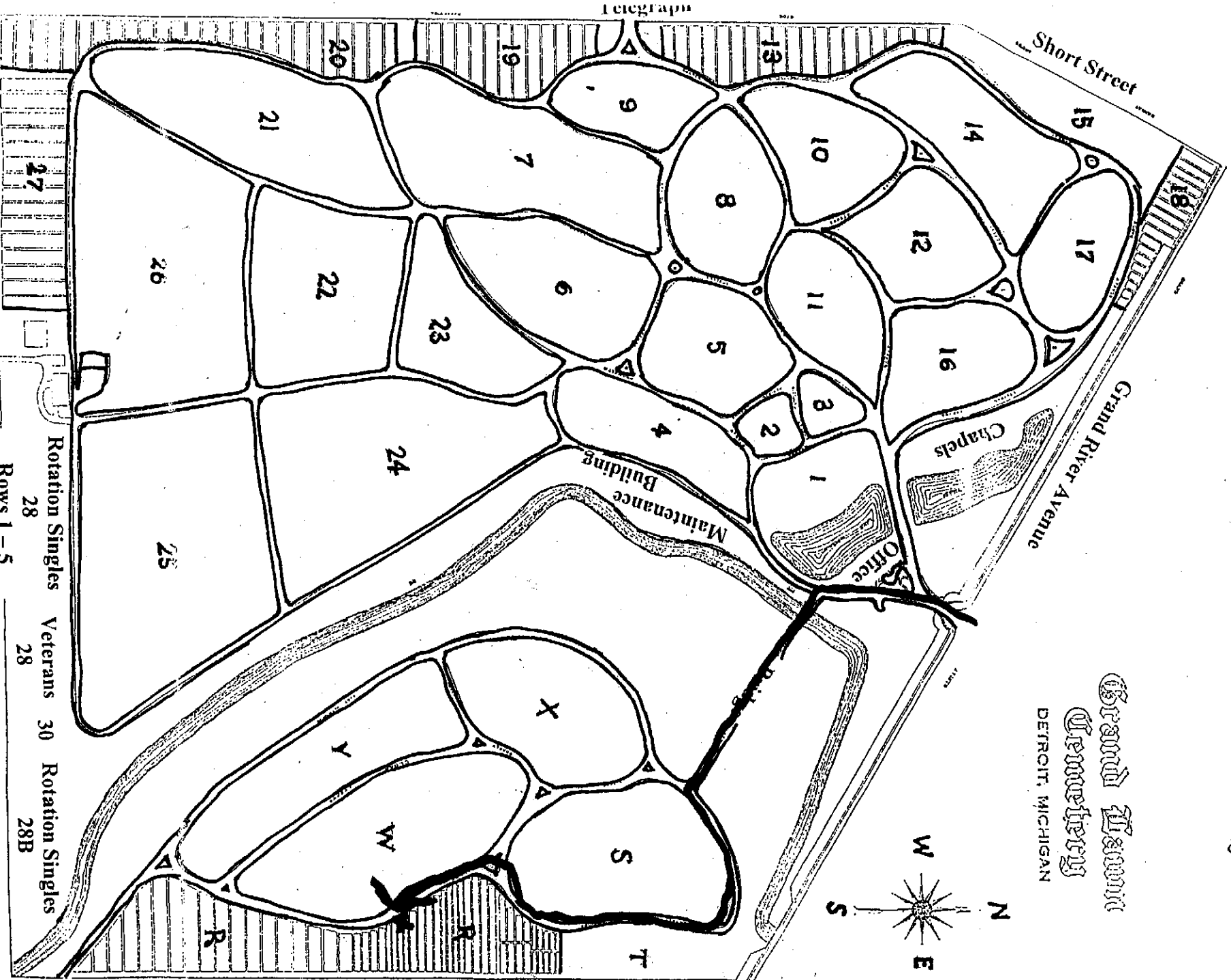

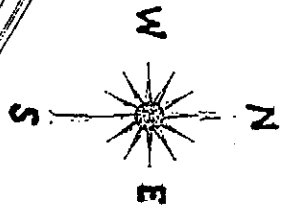
