Richard Watkins and unknown spouse married. They had the following children:

2. i. **Peter Watkins** was born about 1697. He married Anne Nuthall before 10 Nov 1690 in Talbot County. He died on 20 Feb 1694/95.

2. **Peter Watkins-2** (Richard-1) was born about 1697. He died on 20 Feb 1694/95.

Notes for Peter Watkins:

General Notes:

Both Peter and his wife Mary died in Old Frederick County, VA in the portion that became WV. Peter was still alive in 1742 for he was a member of Captain Georg Robinson's Co. of Milita, one of 12 companies named that year to keep the Indians down.

Peter is said to have been called "Jonas", and was connected with the American Colonial Navy during the Revolution. He was in charge of some boats. No documentation has been located to prove this (i.e. couldn't find a Jonas Watkins who served in the Rev. War), but it can be proven that Peter Watkins was the grandfather of Daniel Watkins, Jr. This is significant because it means that Peter Watkins was the father of Evan (Jack) Watkins too.

Mary Griffith daughter of David Griffith.

Peter Watkins and Mary Griffith were married before 1715. They had the following children:

4. i. **Evan "John" Watkins** was born in 1710 in New Castle, Delaware, USA. He died in 1764.

Notes for Evan "John" Watkins:

General Notes:

Evan Watkins was the first ferry boatman on the Potomac River. Evan operated Maidstone-on-the-Potomac and Watkin's Ferry before 1741. He and his wife had seven children: Thomas, David, **Peter**, Jean, Anna, Evan, and Eleanor. Evan, Jr. married Prudence and moved to KY where he died in 1831 in Henry County.

General Notes:

The Peter Watkins of Rutherford County, North Carolina has no known connection to the supposed brothers, Peter, Levin and Michell Watkins, of whom, it is said came from Wales. Peter Watkins was the son of Evan and Mary Watkins of Maryland and it was Evan Watkins who established Watkins Ferry on the Potomac River in Fredrick County, Virginia about 1738.

The information of Peter, Levin and Michell Watkins comes from the M. C. Barrett book, *Pioneers of Craighead County, Arkansas*, and although it is a wonderful research effort, Barrett was incorrect on the ancestry of Peter Watkins. Most current researchers of Peter Watkins are aware of this fact, and the descendants of Levin and Michell Watkins also agree that our Peter had no relationship to them.

Records on the Internet and elsewhere show that Peter Watkins married either Hannah Boone or Hannah Reynold. The maiden name of Peter's wife, Hannah, is unknown, but it has been proven beyond any doubt by Boone, Reynolds, and Watkins researchers that Hannah was neither Boone nor Reynolds.

Peter Watkins and Hannah (unknown) maybe Renuls were married about 1755. They had the following children:

6. i. **Evan "Jack" Watkins** was born in 1768 in Rowan County, North Carolina. He married Mary "Polly" Ann Dill about 1795. He died between 1836-1840 in St. Clair County, Alabama.

6. **Evan "Jack" Watkins-6** (Peter-5, Evan "John"-4, Peter-3, Peter-2, Richard-1) was born in 1768 in Rowan County, North Carolina. He died between 1836-1840 in St. Clair County, Alabama.

Notes for Evan "Jack" Watkins:

Evan "Jack" Watkins moved to St. Clair County in 1819. He lived just west of Hopewell Church, where the D.A.R. School was situated. He and his sons, Jack, Evan, and Phil, were all great lover of fine horses, and sports. They were also great hands to joke and have a good time.

A will for Evan "Jack" Watkins can be found at the St. Clair County Archives in Ashville, Alabama (Deed Book "B", pg 668, written 17 May 1834, filed 21 Sep 1840). The will was witnessed by John F. Dill, Lorenzo Whisenant, and Nancy Dill, wife of John F. Dill. (Some research says Harry/Hebry Dill

also witnessed the will.) In the will Evan leaves his estate to his "wife, Polly". He mentions all 10 of his children by name. At the time the will was written, all four of his daughters were married and are listed by their married surnames, rather than Watkins.

The **1800** Census for Marlboro County, South Carolina shows the following for the Evan Watkins household: 1 white male, 0-10; 1 white male, 16-26, 1 white female 16-26, and 3 slaves. The **1810** Census for Rutherford County, North Carolina lists an Evan Wadkins (incorrectly spelled surname). The **1820** Census for St. Clair County, Alabama lists Evan Watkins (white male 21+) as head of household. In the household are 6 white males under 21, , 1 white female 21+, and 2 white females under 21. The **1830** Census for St. Clair County, Alabama lists Evan Watkins (white male 60-70) as head of household. Also in the household are 3 white males 15-20, 2 white male 20-30, and 1 white female 50-60).

Other Watkins in the St. Clair County 1830 Census include Lewis Watkins, and Willis Watkins. Also, there is documentation for the marriage of an Evan Watkins and Sarah Berry on 29 Jan 1824 in St. Clair County, Alabama. Sarah Berry's father was Armstead Berry, and her guardian was Moses Harri

Mary "Polly" Ann Dill daughter of Joseph Dill and Mary Ann Ross was born in 1774 in Virginia. She died in 1852 in St. Clair County, Alabama.

Notes for Mary "Polly" Ann Dill:

General Notes:

Mary Ann "Polly" Dill was a sister to John Dill, father of Amoretta Dill who was the wife of Abraham B. Green, Sr.

The information below is taken from the *St. Clair County, Alabama Heritage Book*, p. 348.

Rebecca Watkins was the daughter of Evan (Jack) Watkins and Mary Ann (Polly) Dill. This family also lived, at times, in Rutherford County, North Carolina.

Reubin Philips son of James Philips and Mary Watts was born on 07 Oct 1777. He died on 07 Sep 1856.

Notes for Reubin Philips:

General Notes:

The information below is taken from the *St. Clair County, Alabama Heritage Book*, p. 348.

Reubin Philips and wife, Rebecca Watkins, came from the area that today includes Spartanburg and Cherokee Counties in South Carolina, and Rutherford County in North Carolina. Much about his origins, including parentage, is unconfirmed. His tombstone shows his birth date as October 1, 1777. His birthplace was reported in 1850 census as South Carolina, but another source shows North Carolina. One bit of lore says the family changed their surname spelling from Phillips to Philips in order to avoid misdirected mail. Whatever the plausibility of this story (and the authors are skeptical), the family has steadfastly maintained the spelling with one L from the early 1800's to the present.

After his marriage to Rebecca Watkins, Reubin and his wife lived for a time in South Carolina. In about 1819, the year that Alabama joined the union, they moved to St. Clair County. They came with three or four children, and they were accompanied by members of the Watkins and Dill families. In St. Clair County, the Philips' first lived with Samuel Boyd, whose relationship to them is unknown. They purchased land on Canoe Creek, just north-east of Ashville, in 1820. Later, about 1823, they moved to Beaver Creek and established a permanent home, about seven miles east of Ashville. Their home was a two-story hewed log house covered with split shingles, made with a drawing knife. There they prospered and raised a large family. Reubin served as school commissioner around 1840, but his main livelihood was apparently cotton farming.

Legend has it that in 1854 Delinda and family were in a wagon on the way to church, with Jefferson Davis Brown, the youngest of their twelve children, in her lap. The mule team ran wild, and Delinda fell from the wagon and died. Little Jeff and the others survived.

Mary (Polly) Philips was probably named after her maternal grandmother. Polly was deaf. She never married and made her home with her parents, and then with her brother, Ross.

9. iv. **Ross Philips** was born on 31 Oct 1815 in Spartanburg District, South Carolina. He died on 03 Jun 1891 in Mississippi.
- v. **Jackson Philips** was born on 29 May 1819 in probably in St. Clair County, Alabama. He died on 12 Jan 1898 in Ashville,Alabama.

Jackson and his wife had twelve children between 1844 and 1862. Jackson taught at several schools in the county.

James Madison Philips and his wife raised a family of fourteen children. In 1847, he built a large colonial style house on his plantation near Ashville, which still stands. He was active in church, school, and government matters. After his wife's death in 1881, James remarried.

James Madison Philips is said to have died as the results of being kicked by a mule.

Pinckney Philips was the youngest child of Reuben and Rebecca Watkins Philips. He is believed to have been engaged to Margaret Looney, but the two never married. He joined with his brother, Ross, to buy the family farm after their father's death. However, shortly thereafter Pinckney volunteered for military duty in the 10th Alabama, the first company raised in the county. Pinckney was mortally wounded at Manassas, Virginia on June 30, 1862

8. **Green Berry Watkins**-7 (Evan "Jack"-6, Peter-5, Evan "John"-4, Peter-3, Peter-2, Richard-1) was born on 23 Feb 1815 in Rutherford County, North Carolina. He died on 06 Aug 1858 in Jefferson County, Arkansas.

Notes for Green Berry Watkins:

General Notes:

Apparently, Green Watkins was in Com I 9th Ark during the Civil War.

Green Berry was named after his relative, Gov. Green Berry of Maryland. G. B. was a civil engineer that laid out the town plat for Pine Bluff, AR.

Greenberry had some sort of property trial in Jefferson County, Arkansas. '*Civil War Claims in the South*' lists Green B. Watkins in Crawford Co, Arkansas #15811. Kirby Watkins says that Green's property was the subject of a multi-million dollar trial. The lawyer for George Evan Watkins (Kirby's father) took that part of the family Bible relating to Green B. Watkins, and the lawyer failed to return it. This record (copied years before) shows Green and Sarah Tidmore as Pink's parents

G.B. was murdered. He started the Watkins Metalurgical Co., and then he found a deposit of minerals in Jefferson Co AR (the location of Pine Bluff). After he bought the land, a man named Brock killed him and forged the sale of this land. Brock was discovered and fled to Polk Co TX, where he was never prosecuted.

Watkins Philips, to Alabama in 1819. He was a very delicate man and suffered much with rheumatism. He was one of the early school teachers of St. Clair County, Alabama making quite a success of his profession. He served as Probate Judge of this county for sixteen years. He lived about three miles from Ashville when elected and had been following the occupation of a farmer. It is said that Judge Philips was one of the best men that occupied the probate bench, not being a lawyer or a man who had much to do around the courthouse. He came right off his farm and filled the office in a very creditable manner.

In the 1860 census for St. Clair County, Ross Philips was listed as a farmer, age 44. His wife was listed as a housewife, age 37. Six children are listed: Sarah, age 14; Eliza, age 11; Mary, age 8; Walter, age 6; Benjamine, age 4; and James, age 1. Benjamine and James do not show up in later references to this family.

Later, he became a prominent merchant, during reconstruction days. He, his wife, and family abruptly moved to Mississippi in early 1868 where he farmed for a number of years before his death.

An abstract of the *Diary of Ross Philips* is available at the Ashville Museum and Archives, in Ashville. It reads like a short autobiography. An interesting story from the diary relates the circumstances surrounding his abrupt departure from St. Clair County. He left Alabama for Mississippi in early 1868 with Roger Williams after Roger, his business partner and son-in-law, shot and killed a man in a gunfight on December 27, 1867. Roger was quickly acquitted, but Ross and Roger were nearly mobbed by Tories a few days afterward, so they fled. He was a merchant at the time he fled to Mississippi. He served as an Elder at his church, and was a Mason.

Ross' name has gone down to his posterity, as one of good repute, as is shown by the name, Ross, being carried down several generations in the family. Some of the old school houses where he left his legacy of enlightenment remained for many years after his death. He left a diary, owned by his son at Sherman, Mississippi, which showed many traits of his noble character, such as honesty and uprightness.

Following the tradition this branch of Philips, he spelled his surname with one "L" rather than the traditional two "L's". Due to the disgust caused by mixing of mail, this branch of the family dropped one "L".

Ross Philips is buried in Union Church Cemetery, Tupelo (Lee County), Mississippi. His grave marker has fallen over and is broken. It is lying on the ground, apparently at the grave site, since other Philips are buried in the same area. It is becoming badly deteriorated. (See Find a Grave #55876284)

Nannie Philips married Bennet Oldham, a minister of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. In the late 1870's under the leadership of Reverend Bennett, Oldham Oldham Chapel Cumberland Presbyterian Church was organized, and it took its name from this dedicated man of God following his death. This church was originally called The Beaver Creek Congregation.

The land for the church was received by William N. Favor, Bennett Oldham, and William Jones on January 3, 1852. William N. Favor and A. E. Cooper witnessed the signing of the deed on behalf of the people. Other than those two men who witnessed the deed, there were seventeen citizens named in the text of the agreement. They include: Bennett Oldham, William Jones, Reuben Philips, Berry L. Coker, John Watkins, Robert Harp, John Rice, William Johnson, Joel Apling, Thomas Johnson, T. D. Andrews, Andrew Johnson, A. B. Green, Joe Johnson, J. F. Puckett, A. C. Bankford, and J. H. L. Wood.

Secondly, from the proceeds arising from my farm known as the Greesport Farm together with the issues arising from one-half interest in the Ferry together with any personal property I may be seized with at my death to be applied to the maintenance of my dear wife and youngest daughter, Estell Green, and to dispose of any portion that is thought best by my dear wife whom I appoint my sole administratrix to meet my just indebtedness. And Thirdly, I appoint my dear wife, Catherine Green, my sole administratrix to carry out my desires and control the same in my name and stead, to collect any debts due me to receipt for the same, and to pay off all claims, receipt for, and secure the same. And to act in my name and stead so long as she remains single and in the event she marries I desire if she and my heirs thins proper to or is to their interest to sell my real estate and to make an equal division between my lawful heirs allowing of her my dear wife a child's part during her natural life time and at her death to revert back to my lawful heirs. And it is expressly understood that Catherine Green, my administratrix enter into possession of my estate in my name and stead to sue and be sued with all the rights and privileges guaranteed to me under the laws and constitution of the state of Alabama and US and with heirs of said A. B.Green to make warranty deeds to any or all of my real estate. And the said executrix, Catherine Green, at my death to enter into possession of my estate without bond or administration.
